



Biblical reference: Lk 5: 1-11; Matt 4: 18-22.


JESUS CALLS THE OTHER DISCIPLES

The bridegroom didn't know that it was Jesus who turned water into wine.


Everybody in the party was amazed.

Jesus came back to the cities of Galilee. Seeing the crowds, He went up the mount and sat down, and began to teach everybody there, saying,




The beatitudes

Biblical reference: Matt 8: 14-15; Mk 1: 29-31; Lk 4: 38-39.


THE MAN WITH A SHRIVELED HAND

Some fell on the rocks, and sprang up quickly, and became a small plant. However, because the soil was shallow the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. They don't have faith and do wrong things that Jesus doesn't like. So they cannot be saved. Thus, they also begin to speak of the Lord to their friends, teaching them to practice good and right things. These are the people who go to heaven and shall live with Him in Paradise forever.

Biblical reference: Mk 4: 1-20; Matt 13: 1-9; 10-23; Lk 8: 4-8; 9-15.

They had a little book with many things written on it, and they tried to practice all that because they thought this way they would be accepted and loved by God. What a pity! The disciples were afraid, but Jesus was sleeping quietly.




The disciples went to Him and woke Him up. He rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!"

THE RESURRECTION OF JAIRUS' DAUGHTER


Jesus was still speaking with the woman when some men came from the house of Jairus, saying, "Your daughter is dead. Do not trouble the teacher any longer."

Biblical reference: Mk 5: 35-43; Matt 9: 23-26; Lk 8: 49-56.


THE HEALING OF A PARALYTIC AT CAPERNAUM

So she told someone to send a message to Him. A person came to Jesus and said, "Your mother and brothers are outside looking for you."

Biblical reference: Matt 12: 46-50; Mk 3: 31-35; Lk 8: 19-21.

Jesus saw that there were many people in Israel needed to hear His word and He alone couldn't do this. He needed help to preach in other cities too. So He called His twelve disciples and gave them power and authority to drive out demons, to preach the word of God and to heal the sick. Biblical reference: Lk 9: 1-6; Lk 10: 1-12; Lk 10: 17-20; Matt 10: 5-15.

THE PARABLE OF THE LOST SON

One day Jesus was telling a story, "A man had two sons. The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the property.' So he divided his property between them. And the younger son set off for a distant land and there he spent everything he had and did ugly things. Then, there was famine in that place and he began to feel hungry. He hired himself out to a citizen of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed pigs. He was so hungry that he longed to fill his stomach with the food the pigs were eating. Then he thought, 'My father's hired men have so much food, and here I am starving to death! I will go back to my father and ask him to forgive me for what I did.' When he was almost arriving, his father saw him and ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him. The son asked his forgiveness and cried. But the father said to his servants to bring sandals, the best robe and a ring to him. So, he thought that they should throw a party to celebrate because his son came back home. But the older son got jealous because there was a feast to his brother who had done many wrong things, while he who had ever done everything right had never got one. Then his father answered, 'My son, you are always with me, and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found."



The younger son, despite having sinned, repented and was welcomed back by his father with a feast because he was dead in

the soul because of his sin, but when received forgiveness he came to live again. Therefore, the older brother who had always been right before his father, without sinning, didn't need to get angry or jealous because everything the father owned was his by right. That's why we feel happy when people turn to Jesus. Biblical reference: Lk 15: 11-32.


But Jesus answered, "You give them something to eat."

A great storm came and the disciples rowed with difficulty, because of the strong wind. Jesus saw that they were in trouble and needed His help.





Biblical reference: Lk 17: 11-19.


THE WOMAN OF SAMARIA

Still in the territory of Samaria Jesus came to a town called Sychar. While His disciples went out to buy food, He sat down by a well. It was about noon. A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, "Will you give me water to drink?"

"You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink? (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans)."

Jesus answered that she knew not whom she was talking to, for if she knew, He would give her living water. They talked for a long time, until the woman acknowledged that Jesus was a different man; He knew everything. He alone had living water, His word, and if someone drank this water He had, would never be thirsty again, and this water would give the person eternal life.

Do you know the story of the Good Samaritan?



A certain man was traveling when he was robbed by thieves, who beat him and hurt him. Then they ran away. He almost died. A priest was going down the same road but didn't help him. Likewise, another man that was a kind of helper of the priest passed by, but he did nothing. Then, a Samaritan who was traveling came to where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds and put him on his donkey. He took the wounded man to an inn and took care of him. The next day he took out silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, "Look after him, and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have."

Jesus was teaching to have mercy on other people. He wanted to teach us that we should love God first and above anything we have, but we also should love our neighbor, that is, our friends and all the people who are on our side needing our help.

Don't you feel glad when you can help someone? It's too good, isn't it?

Biblical reference: Lk 10: 25-37.

JESUS BLESSES THE CHILDREN

Jesus arrived to a small village and people brought Him some children to lay His hands on them and pray, but the disciples rebuked them.



Where He arrived, children came to meet Him and He spent time with them, blessing them and kissing them. He liked the joy and the innocence of the children. So, He said to His disciples, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs. Whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it. Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me also welcomes my Father. See that you do not look down on one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father in heaven. Therefore, he who humbles himself like this child, this one is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven."

After saying this, Jesus laid His hand on them and blessed them.

Biblical reference: Mk 10: 13-16; Matt 19: 13-15; Lk 18: 15-17.

THE RICH YOUNG MAN

A very rich young man approached Jesus and asked Him what he should do to inherit eternal life.

Jesus said that he should obey God's commandments: to honor father and mother, not to murder, not to steal, not to bear false witness against the neighbor and not to cheat anyone.

But the young man declared he did all this since he was a boy.

So, Jesus told him, "You still lack one thing. Sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."

When he heard this, he became very sad, because he had a great wealth.



The young man was rich and thought he could get the attention from Jesus. However, Jesus wanted him to understand that to please God he should love Him more than money. In fact, he could remain rich if he learned to give a little of what he had to the poor, but he was so stingy that he could only enter the kingdom of God if sold everything and stayed with nothing. So, we must always ask Jesus what He wants us to do with our money. And if He tells us to give something to those who have nothing, we must obey Him.

Biblical reference: Matt 19: 16-22; Mk 10: 17-22; Lk 18: 18-23.

THE PARABLE OF THE TEN VIRGINS

Jesus told another story about two kinds of people: those who pay attention to the things of God and are going to live in heaven with Him and those who are absent-minded and don't care much about Jesus and, therefore, will not live in heaven.

"The kingdom of heaven is like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones took their lamps but did not take any oil with them. The wise, however, took oil in jars along with their lamps. The bridegroom was a long time in coming, and they all became drowsy and fell asleep. At midnight they heard a cry, 'Here's the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!' Then all the virgins woke up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil; our lamps are going out.' But the wise said, 'There may not be enough for both us and you. Go buy some oil for yourselves.' While they were on their way to buy the oil, the bridegroom arrived. The virgins who were ready went in with him to the wedding banquet. And the door was shut. Later the others also came and said, "Sir! Sir! Open the door for us!" But he replied, 'I tell you the truth, I don't know you."




Jesus promised that one day He will come back to fetch us. But only the people who are ready will realize this, that is, those who are Jesus' friends and care about God's things, those who practice His words and do good. These people are like the virgins who kept the

lamps lit. Those people who don't care about Jesus' things; those who do evil and only worry about the earthly things are absent-minded, sleeping; they are fool. Their spirit is more like a candle that was gone out. These people are like the absent-minded virgins, the foolish ones who let their lamp go out. They will not enter heaven. No one knows when Jesus will come back.

Biblical reference: Matt 25: 1-13.

THE PARABLE OF THE WEDDING

Jesus told the people another story, talking again about the kingdom of heaven. He said, "The kingdom of heaven is like a king who prepared a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his servants to those who had been invited, but they refused to come. Then he sent some more servants and said, 'Tell those who have been invited that I have prepared my dinner. Everything is ready. Come to the wedding banquet.' But they paid no attention and went off-one to his field, another to his business. The rest seized his servants and mistreated them. The king was very angry and sent his soldiers to punish those wicked men. Then he said to his servants, 'Go to the street corners and invite to the banquet anyone you find.' So the servants gathered many people, and the wedding hall was filled. But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing wedding clothes. He asked, 'Friend, how did you get in here without wedding clothes?' The man was speechless. Then the king told the attendants, 'Tie him hand and foot, and throw him outside. For many are invited, but few are chosen."



God has already prepared in heaven a great banquet for all people, but because of pride, they always give an excuse to not be friends of Jesus and despise all those who Jesus sends to talk about Him. Therefore, they can no longer sit at the table of the Lord's banquet in heaven. But those who are humble and accept to be Jesus' friends are entitled to join the party that He is preparing in heaven. The Lord forgives all who repent of their sins, and these ones get a clean soul, as if it was dressed in feast garments, appropriate to a wedding. But those who do evil and don't repent are like that man who didn't have wedding clothes. Their souls are dirty by sin. These stubborn and rebellious people who don't accept to be Jesus' friends, He sends to hell.

Biblical reference: Matt 22: 1-14.

JESUS HEALS THE SICK

When Jesus arrived somewhere, people heard about it and began to run to Him because they knew He had the power to cure diseases and make the great miracles that they needed. Jesus healed the lame and drove out demons from people. He made the blind see and gave children to women who could not have them. He brought friendship and peace, and made people reconcile, instead of arguing. Jesus also healed the lepers. The deaf began to hear. Who was sad and crying began to laugh. Many people learned to forgive and love their fellow men, and this was good. They began to understand what Jesus was talking about and so, they changed their way of thinking and acting. They were rejecting evil and learning to do what is good. Rather than get complaining, people began to learn a very important thing: to praise the Lord. Jesus caused them to feel loved by God, and they would never feel the rejection from anyone again.



Now you know that Jesus is able to heal all kinds of disease and solve all our problems.

If you want to ask Him for something now, do it. And He will hear and answer your prayer.

Biblical reference: Matt 8: 16-17; Mk 1: 32-34; Lk 4: 40-41.

ZACCHAEUS THE TAX COLLECTOR

In the city of Jericho there was a wealthy man named Zacchaeus, a chief tax collector. He wanted to see Jesus, but he was short and could not see the Master because of the crowd. So he ran ahead and climbed a tree to see Him, since Jesus was going to pass by that way. When Jesus reached the spot, He looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly. I must stay at your house today."

So he came down at once and welcomed Him gladly.



They were already eating when Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, "Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount."

Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost."

Zacchaeus repented of having stolen money of many people; so, he was forgiven by Jesus and received a gift that his money could never buy; the eternal life. Jesus can change the hearts of all people, when they let Him do it.

Biblical reference: Lk 19: 1-10.

THE RESURRECTION OF LAZARUS

Jesus went to Bethany to see His friend Lazarus who was very sick. He was friend of Lazarus and his sisters, Martha and Mary.

When He got there, Jesus learned that Lazarus had died four days ago. Martha and Mary came to Jesus, crying, and they said, "Lord, if you had been here, our brother would not have died."

But Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die."

Jesus wept and asked them where they have laid Lazarus. They led Jesus to the tomb.

Then He said to the men who were there, "Take away the stone."

They took away the stone, and Jesus said aloud, "Lazarus, come out!"



Lazarus came out of the sepulcher. He was alive again. Good thing! Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary, and had seen what Jesus did, put their faith in Him. But some of them went to Jesus' enemies and told them what He had done.

Biblical reference: Jn 11: 1-46

JESUS CLEARS THE TEMPLE

When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple courts He found men selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. So He made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple, including sheep and cattle; He scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. He said, "Take these things out of here! How dare you turn my Father's house into a market place!"



Many people saw this and believed in Him.

Why was Jesus so angry with the sale of those animals inside the temple?

In those days people used to sell animals and exchange money in the Temple Courts. Then they gave the animals as a present to Daddy in heaven so that He forgave their sins, but this kind of thing didn't please Him. Today, we don't need to do this because Jesus has already forgiven our sins, by dying on the cross. The best way to please God is being Jesus' friend and doing the things He likes.

Biblical reference: Jn 2: 13-22.

JESUS THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Jesus walked through the Temple and the people wanted to listen to Him. Then He said, "I am the Good Shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. Whoever believes in me will be saved. I call my sheep by name and go ahead of them, and the sheep follow me because they know my voice; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."




Jesus is the way and the truth and the life. He leads us to heaven, and gives us salvation. Who believes in Him is saved. Jesus came that His sheep may have a life full of good things. He died on the cross for us to be forgiven and freed of sin, receiving eternal life.

He knows you and me, and all those who are His "sheep." And we, as obedient sheep, we hear His voice in our hearts and follow Him. When we are willing to read the bible, to pray and talk to Jesus and practice His love, it's a sign that we are His little sheep.

Biblical reference: Jn 10: 1-18.

THE POOR WIDOW'S OFFERING

Jesus sat down in front of the place where the offerings were given and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, of very little value. Calling His disciples to Him, Jesus said, "This poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything she had, all she had to live on."




Jesus was teaching an important thing: to give the best to God, the best we can give: not only money, but the best we have to make Him happy and to help His church and people around us, like a kiss, an embrace, a song to the Lord and all good things He puts into our hearts. The widow was not greedy, nor was afraid to starve or feel needy because she had faith in the Lord that He would supply all her needs. Sometimes we give something and then receive another thing much better from hands of people we couldn't even imagine that would help us. It is because God touched these people and they gave us what we needed. This strengthens our faith.

Biblical reference: Mk 12: 41-44; Lk 21: 1-4.

THE PARABLE OF THE TALENTS

Jesus proposed another story to the people, "A man going on a journey called his servants and gave money to them. The coins were called "talents." To one servant he gave five coins, to another two coins, and to another one coin, each according to his ability to trade. The man who had received the five talents went at once and put his money to work and gained five more. So also, the one with the two talents gained two more. But the man who had received the one talent went off, dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money."



When the master of those servants returned the men who had received the five and two coins (talents) brought the other coins they got, and the master was glad with them. But the man who had received the one talent and hid it in the ground returned it to his master, and he became angry with his servant because he had not put his money on deposit with the bankers; so when he returned he would have received it back with interest. He said, "Take him out of my sight. I don't want to see him anymore."

Jesus wanted to show that we should exercise our abilities, helping ourselves and other people. This way we multiply the gifts and blessings ("talents") He gives us. In heaven we'll receive our reward and will live with Him forever.

Biblical reference: Matt 25: 14-30.

JESUS ANOINTED BY A SINFUL WOMAN

Jesus was invited to have dinner with a religious man of those times, a Pharisee called Simon. He entered the house and reclined at the table. A sinful woman learned that Jesus was eating there and brought a beautiful jar of perfumed oil of nard. She stood behind Jesus weeping, and began to wet His feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfumed oil on them.

Simon thought with himself, "How Jesus, being a prophet, could let a sinful woman like that touch Him?"

But Jesus knew what Simon was thinking and told him, "Simon, do you see this woman? I forgive all her sins."



Then Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace and sin no more."

The Jews used to wash the feet of the guests and anoint their head with oil and kiss their cheeks. Simon had not done anything of this, but the woman washed His feet with her tears, dried them with her hair and poured perfume on them, for the love of Jesus and to demonstrate her repentance because she recognized that she had many sins. Jesus forgave her and she came back happily to her home."

Did you see? Jesus forgives all our sins.

Biblical reference: Lk 7: 36-50.

JESUS TEACHES NICODEMUS

At night, a man named Nicodemus came to Jesus and said, "Rabbi, we know that everything you teach comes from God. For no one could perform the miracles you are doing if God were not with him."

Jesus replied, "No one can see the kingdom of God unless he is born again."

Nicodemus asked, "How can a man be born again when he is old? Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb to be born again!"

Jesus answered, "What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. You must be born again."



Nicodemus asked, "How can this be?"

Jesus said, "God so loved the world that he gave His Only Begotten Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

Whoever repents of his sins, believes in Jesus and surrenders his life to Him and is baptized in the water begins to live a new life, receiving the Holy Spirit and salvation. It's as if this person was born again. It is the Holy Spirit who teaches us to do His will, that is, what is good.

Biblical reference: Jn 3: 1-21.

THE LAST SUPPER

The Jewish Passover Time came, and also had come the time for Jesus to die on the cross for us and save us. At night, before dying on the cross, Jesus and His disciples went to a house where there was a large room. It was a special dinner, and Jesus taught them many things. They ate bread and drank wine and understood that they should love one another as Jesus had loved them.



Jesus also warned them that one of them would betray Him, handing Him over to the temple priests and the roman soldiers. They began to worry; who among them would do this? Judas Iscariot was the traitor, so he got out swiftly and went to talk to Jesus' enemies.

Jesus also said that He would rise again after three days. After eating He got out of there and went to the Mount of Olives with His disciples.

Biblical reference: Lk 22: 7-30.

Then, Jesus died. They laid Him in a sepulcher and put a very heavy stone at the entrance so that nobody could take His body away from there. It was Friday when He died.

Biblical reference: Jn 19: 17-30.

Early on Sunday, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene, who was one the women that followed Him, went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. She came running to Simon Peter and John, and said, "The Lord is not in the tomb!"

Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news, "I have seen the Lord! He is risen!"

Hurray! How good! Jesus is alive! He's risen! He conquered death! So whoever believes in Him never dies, but has everlasting life. His enemies were ashamed. Aha!

Biblical reference: Matt 28: 1-10; Mk 16: 1-8; Lk 24: 1-12; Jn 20: 1-10.

PETER IS RESTORED BY JESUS

A few more days passed and Simon Peter went to Galilee along with other disciples, near the sea.

Then, he told them, "I'm going out to fish."

"We'll go with you."

They got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. He called out to them, "Friends, haven't you any fish to eat?"

They answered they didn't. So, He said, "Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some."

They did what Jesus commanded, and suddenly, the net was full of fish, and there were so many that they could barely pull it. John recognized that the man on the beach was Jesus and said to Peter, "It is the Lord!"

Peter swam to the shore to see Jesus.
